# **Luke 22:24–30 (ESV)**

<sup>24</sup>A dispute also arose among them, as to which of them was to be regarded as the greatest.

<sup>25</sup>And he said to them, "The kings of the Gentiles exercise lordship over them, and those in authority over them are called benefactors. <sup>26</sup>But not so with you. Rather, let the greatest among you become as the youngest, and the leader as one who serves. <sup>27</sup>For who is the greater, one who reclines at table or one who serves? Is it not the one who reclines at table? But I am among you as the one who serves.
