³⁵And he said to them, "When I sent you out with no moneybag or knapsack or sandals, did you lack anything?" They said, "Nothing."

³⁶He said to them, "But now let the one who has a moneybag take it, and likewise a knapsack. And let the one who has no sword sell his cloak and buy one.

³⁷For I tell you that this Scripture must be fulfilled

in me: 'And he was numbered with the transgressors.' For what is written about me has its fulfillment."

³⁸And they said, "Look, Lord, here are two swords." And he said to them, "It is enough." "The Great Exchange"

Jesus quotes Isaiah 53:12 here in v. 37. What is the redemptive impact of Jesus being "numbered" with transgressors, and (by implication) of our being numbered with the righteous?

What is imputation? How is it related to the doctrine of justification by faith alone?
