

## **Luke 22:35–38 (ESV)**

<sup>35</sup>And he said to them, “When I sent you out with no moneybag or knapsack or sandals, did you lack anything?” They said, “Nothing.”

<sup>36</sup>He said to them, “But now let the one who has a moneybag take it, and likewise a knapsack. And let the one who has no sword sell his cloak and buy one.

<sup>37</sup>For I tell you that this Scripture must be fulfilled in me: ‘And he was numbered with the transgressors.’ For what is written about me has its fulfillment.”

<sup>38</sup>And they said, “Look, Lord, here are two swords.” And he said to them, “It is enough.”

## *“The Great Exchange”*

### **His Provision**

*What is Jesus teaching the disciples in reminding them of His provision for them during their earlier preaching mission trip (9:1-6) relative to their preparation for the hours to come?*

*What is the relationship between faith/trust in God and the responsibility to prepare for hardship and opposition?*

*What kind of preparation is Jesus urging the disciples to undertake?*

### **Our Justification**

*What effect should having the certainty of the fulfillment of biblical prophecy have on us? (note v.13)*

*Jesus quotes Isaiah 53:12 here in v. 37. What is the redemptive impact of Jesus being “numbered” with transgressors, and (by implication) of our being numbered with the righteous?*

*What is imputation? How is it related to the doctrine of justification by faith alone?*
